The Penn State program offers a vibrant community of faculty, actively engaged in a variety of roles:

- ➤ The program at Penn State is recognized nationally and internationally as one of the top research programs focused on the needs of children who require AAC;
- ➤ The core academic and clinical faculty have more than 40 externally funded grants, over 180 publications in peer-reviewed journals, and over 500 presentations at state, national, and international conferences, active involvement on editorial boards, and extensive experience in evidence based practice in AAC.

Students in the program have access to a comprehensive curriculum with in-depth exposure to issues related to AAC:

- Core courses dedicated to AAC, including advanced topics in AAC, interdisciplinary approaches to evidence-based practice, and diversity and global issues in AAC;
- ➤ Related coursework in statistics, methodology, and elective areas of language, neurology, grant writing, etc., that help to train students with a breadth of knowledge;
- ➤ Completion of at least three mentored research projects, structured to result in conference presentations and publications over the course of study;
- ➤ Direct experience with teaching, including classroom teaching and mentorship of research and/or clinical experiences of pre-service students (undergraduate or Master's level).
