Diane Thiboutot, MD, is an endowed Professor of Dermatology at the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine in Hershey, PA. In her clinical practice at Hershey Medical Center she specializes in the care of patients with acne and rosacea. Dr. Thiboutot received her medical degree and residency training in Dermatology at the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine and University Hospital. Awards from the Dermatology Foundation and National Institutes of Health fostered her early research career. Dr. Thiboutot currently directs an active research program in both basic and clinical research with the support from the NIH and partners in the pharmaceutical industry. Her area of research interest is in the regulation of sebum production and the treatment of acne with particular emphasis on the role of hormones and retinoid activity.

Dr. Thiboutot is the Associate Dean of Clinical and Translational Research Education at Penn State University College of Medicine and serves on the steering committee for the college's MD/PhD program. Dr. Thiboutot is a member of the AOA Honor Medical Society and is recent past president of the American Acne and Rosacea Society. She is listed in *The Best Doctors in America*. Dr. Thiboutot received her University's Outstanding Young Investigator Award in 1996 for her work on androgen metabolism in the skin in addition to a Faculty Teaching Award from the Medical Student Class. Dr. Thiboutot serves as a reviewer for several dermatology journals. She has published numerous manuscripts and book chapters relating to acne and hormone metabolism in the skin and has served as principal investigator on over 100 clinical trials in acne and rosacea over the past 18 years.
