Syllabus Checklist

<u>Faculty Senate Policy 43-00</u> (http://senate.psu.edu/policies-and-rules-for-undergraduate-students/43-00-syllabus/) *requires* that a written (paper or electronic form) syllabus must be distributed to students in each course on or before the first class meeting, and the syllabus must remain available to students electronically until the end of the semester. The syllabus must include:

- Contact information for all course instructors
- Required course materials
- Course content and expectations
- Location of the program (i.e., class meeting times and location)
- Course Goals and Objectives
- Grade Breakdown by Assessment Type and Percentage
- Examination Policy (include evening exam schedule, if applicable)
- Academic Integrity Statement**
- Information on procedures related to academic adjustments identified by the Office of Disability Services**
- Information on available Counseling & Psychological Services**
- Reporting Educational Equity Concerns through the Report Bias site**

Changes to the syllabus (e.g., changes to policies or due dates) must be distributed in written form (paper or electronic). Although not required, a syllabus "subject to change statement" is recommended.

A syllabus is a roadmap that students follow in order to be successful in a course. A thorough syllabus will contain most or all of the following items, some of which cover required items listed at the top of this sheet.
