

ConnectED: A Penn State York Library First-Year Experience

The Penn State York Library has been piloting ConnectED since Fall 2014. First-year students earn ConnectED points by participating in library-sponsored events and by making connections to others on campus, working toward winning a \$2,014 award to use toward second-year tuition at Penn State York.

THE RESEARCH



Librarians are increasingly challenged to demonstrate "the value of academic and research libraries and their contribution to institutional mission and goals" (ACRL, 2010, p.6). While most people might think of the library in terms of the academic support we provide, I chose to focus on another important area—social engagement.

"The more students are academically and socially engaged with other people on campus . . . the more likely (other things being equal) they will stay and graduate from college" (Tinto, 2012, p. 64).


Research question:

To what extent can participation in a library first-year experience increase student engagement in our commuter campus community and support first-year academic success?

THE PROGRAM

Students use gameboards to track their participation in the program, receiving stickers for each event they attend. They also record the connections they make. First-year students received the gameboards and Connection Cards at the beginning of the semester.









The 5 literacies of **PA Forward**, an initiative of the Pennsylvania Library Association, form the foundation of the ConnectED program.

Since we have had 23 events so far this academic year, it was also helpful to have some common formats for programs so we didn't have to think of something new each time we planned an event.

Flash Forums are conversations facilitated by a Penn State York faculty or staff member concerning pressing, current events before they fade from the news.

A **Speak Easy** is an opportunity for conversation in a relaxed, informal setting for anyone who wants to improve their public speaking.

ConnecTED Talks are programs incorporating a TED Talk and activity into our conversation.

We also had Marathon Reads, Booktalks, Memory Match games, and events celebrating special occasions, such as Constitution Day, Halloween, and the Chinese New Year.
