



- 1870 15th Amendment (Black Men)
- 1913 17th Amedment (Senators)
- 1920 19th Amendment (Women)
- 1964 24th Amendment (Poll Tax)
- 1965 Voting Rights Act
- 1971 26th Amendment (18-21)
- 2013 Shelby v. Holder

- Gave Attorney General of US ability to review redistricting
- Section 5 Preclearance for new voting practices and procedures




Changing Voting Practices...

- Registration difficulty (deadlines, forms)




Drawing the Lines

Who controls redistricting?






