Official vs. Unofficial Actors

I like terms formal and informal

Formal (Official)

Have a specific legal authority, have legal power and responsibility in policymaking process.

Informal (Unofficial)

Not legally required to engage, but have a right to be involved. Just as important.

Understanding Formal Actors


Iron Triangles or Issue Networks?

What do they do? What do they provide?




