The first component comprised the development of curriculum materials, a website, and performances in public spaces as pedagogical strategies to address the global water crisis. This project emphasized an awareness of the global water crisis affecting the African diaspora. In this first stage I was responsible for the development of the website, and contributing to the design of deliverables and curriculum materials for k-12 education. For the second stage, Dr. Carpenter and I collaborated with two professors, one graduate student, and several undergraduate students from material science and mechanical engineering in the advance of a material-enabled low-cost approach to provide clean water in remote areas. I developed an estheticized literature reviewed of historical and current research and responses to the global water crisis using an online interactive timeline (tiki-toki.com).
