She gained her free-Δn dom by the aid of the projectors of the Sar famous "underground railway," who err spirited her over the Mason and Dixon cra line. She came to this county, where the she was married to Mr. Dorman. Two pro sons of the decedent, Jacob and George, "followed the flag." Jacob was killed uri by the blowing up of a gunboat on the Ph James river, in Virginia, in 1864. It hе was a federal boat and was destroyed Li by the rebels. George served a numdei ber of years in the regular service, wa roughing it with the Forty-first Penn-DB. sylvanians in the southwest. In a fight Un with the Indians on the Rio Grande ele river, in Texas, in 1884, he was wounded in the hip and still carries the ball as a sea memento of the engagement. in
