## TRIANGLE OFFENSIVE PRINCIPLES

## SIMPLE - "Common Sense Football"

"We have 2 run plays – we run inside and we run outside"
\*formations – people – blocking schemes can all change – find your core!
"Minimize Techniques to Maximize the Mastery"

# SOUND - "Win critical and beat blitz"

"Teach to win critical (run the ball) and teach to beat blitz (multiple ways)"

# SOLID - "Whole-Part-Whole teaching"

"Start simple, start sound, start slow by showing the big picture - then teaching details" 
\*system needs to be multiple in look only – use stacking system to simplify learning!

\*Key is to not have HOLES in the system!

"There are no magic plays - build a system - not a bunch of plays"

# You Design the offensive system you want – Make it *Simple-Sound-Solid*

"We run a modern college offense @ the 9<sup>th</sup> grade level with SUCCESSFUL RESULTS" – Paul Hefty (State College High, PA – 9<sup>th</sup> grade assistant coach)

#### \*CHECK OUT THESE STATS (credibility -concrete - simple)

**NEW 2015 Packaged Plays -** using *inside and outside run as the foundation* while attacking multiple defensive keys that are complimented by combination routes on the perimeter (attacking multiple defenders) \* CHECK OUT THESE STATS – 2015 STATE COLLEGE HIGH 9TH GRADE OFFENSE: 80% of plays run were packaged plays or PAP - which produced 1800 yards rushing @ 5.9 yard average (306 run plays = 73% of offensive plays) + 1500 Yards passing @ 24.5 yards per catch (110 pass plays = 27% of offensive plays) – 3300 total yards in 10 games – scoring 50 TD's (30 rushing and 20 passing) \*5 different backs

**NEW 2015 Multi-Vert Play-Action-Pass package** combines vertical concepts with HOT crossers (Outstanding Blitz Beaters) \*\*\*this is a combination of research from The University of Oregon and The Ohio State University Offensive Systems (2015 National championship contestants)

\*20 passing TD's and only \*3 Interceptions between 2 different Qbs
