- a. Athletics Update Staci Brennan
 - i. Thanks to all who came to the volleyball game last night. The energy was very positive!
 - ii. Athletics Academic Report Spring 2023
 - 1. Spring GPA average 3.26 (last 12 semesters have been over 3.0)
 - 2. 3rd Place in the USCAA national governing body. Among 68 institutions. Highest ranking in history. We are the highest among our conference within the PSU system.
 - 3. TEAM CGPA spreadsheet was shared broken down by sport and season.
 - a. Additional information was shared about the number of students who participated in each sport. Headcount of student athletes: 124

- b. Number of students on Dean's List by sport was shared, 41% were on the Dean's List for SP23.
- c. Semester GPA of 3.00 or higher was shared per sport. 72% had above a 3.00.
- d. Normal progress requirements of student athletes spreadsheet was shared that assists Staci in determining eligibility. Department expectations is 3.0. Requirements are measured at the beginning of each semester.
- e. Academically ineligible spreadsheet was shown.
- 4. Recruiting Class
 - a. Out of the incoming class for FA23 there are 198, 23% of incoming students were student athletes.
 - b. "Recruited" means the coach was the first point of contact to the student.
 - c. Shared states students are recruited from.
- 5. 129 current student athletes for FA23. Down 4 from last year.
 - a. Losing 2 sports has not impacted the numbers
- 6. Graduation Rates
 - a. Student Athletes vs Non Student Athletes numbers across the conference campuses
 - i. 87% student athletes
 - ii. 66% non-student athletes
 - b. Looking at determining GPA comparison data for Mont Alto students.
- 7. Questions/Comments
 - a. Spirit week is next week and canned food drive. Please participate, take photos, and share.
 - b. Remember the faculty athletics committee is also a great place to share questions and concerns.
- b. Update on early and mid-semester progress reports Mike Doncheski
 - i. Mike will send an update email following the meeting that will provide details regarding the mid-semester progress reports.

 - iii. Advisers are currently only getting emails about flags. Reviewing to dos will require the adviser to look up the information.

 - vi. Fall Sept 11 (two days before close of EPR period). Over 1200 tracking items were raised.
 - vii. In total, 2379 tracking items were raised, 42 sections did not get completed. Narrowing down the discrepancies there were 7 faculty/11 sections that were not submitted.
 - viii. Currently in mid-semester progress period.
