An Insulin Price Cap




The United States insulin market is controlled entirely by 3 companies: Novo Nordisk, Eli Lilly and Sanofi. These companies have a monopoly on the product, which is part of why insulin costs have risen so high. In the past, price controls have been used to regulate monopolies like public utility companies.

Due to the rapid rise in insulin costs, some have taken to foreign purchases to save money. Insulin is far cheaper in Canada, which has led to "insulin caravans" forming in search of lower prices.





Type 1 Diabetes Treatment Costs

From 2012 to 2016, total costs to treat Type 1 diabetes, which requires insulin to stay alive, rose by 48%. Much of that was driven by a near 100% increase in the cost of insulin in that time.
