



Worker Unions: For Organizing or Not	For Unions. Believes there is <u>“a war on organizing, collective bargaining, unions, and workers. It’s been raging for decades, and it’s getting worse with Donald Trump in the White House.”</u>	For Unions. Wants to give power back to the working people. <u>“I will partner with Congress, use bold executive action, and leverage the federal procurement process to pursue the most progressive and comprehensive agenda for workers since the New Deal.”</u>	For Unions. <u>“Sanders’s plan calls for the end to “at-will” employment, aims to double union membership in his first term in office, and advocates for industry-wide collective bargaining.”</u>
