1. Gun Violence Control

In both, Ohio and Wisconsin, the gun control and the prevention of gun violence are in the top 5 issues that regional democratic voters would like their delegates to address. While it does not seem to be a great concern to Republicans, Democrats in Wisconsin are actively trying to reduce the gun violence by proposing solutions to the problem such as the red flag law and a more detailed background check of anybody who wants to purchase a gun. (CBS 58, WUWM) Also in Ohio, Cory Booker promises to develop “the most comprehensive gun violence prevention plan of any candidate for president in decades,” if selected. (ABC News)

2. Education Funding

In the region 6C, especially in Wisconsin, education funding appears to be one of the biggest concerns among democratic voters. According to the “For Our Future and For Our Future Action Fund”, the people of Wisconsin believe that the poor education funding situation is induced by the decisions and actions of the current republican governor in the state - Scott Walker. Democrats, unlike the Republicans in Wisconsin who underfunded public education, “plan to provide \$618.8 million in general aid.” (Wisconsin Senate Democrats)

3. Environment

Democratic delegates in both Ohio and Wisconsin are aware of the environmental issues and the urgency of addressing them. Voters appear to be concerned the most about clean water and energy. Democratic delegates in Ohio will be focusing on reducing air pollution caused by coal mining, and they will also focus on producing more clean energy in the form of utilizing solar panels.
