Course

We have several goals contributing to our overall interest in reading continuous Greek:

- 1. to consolidate the morphology, syntax, and vocabulary learned in Greek 101
- 2. to master additional vocabulary and morphological and syntactical patterns
- 3. to get lots of experience reading and discussing actual Greek paragraphs
- 4. to practice teaching an audience how to read a passage
- 5. to appreciate the cultural, conceptual, and philosophical interest in specific Greek words and in ancient literary passages

Class time

Each day we will sit in a close circle and take equal responsible for translation, drills, questions, and providing each other with good ways to learn. You should always come prepared—having read the lesson, gone over the drills and exercises, and translated the Greek readings. You should take notes every day about everything discussed.

Quizzes

You will take twenty-four 5-point quizzes at the start of many classes; you will have a strictly-timed five minutes to complete them. You need take only twenty for full credit; additional quizzes count as bonus. You may not make up a quiz unless you have a

documented medical excuse; absence or tardiness is not sufficient excuse. Quizzes together are worth 25% of your course grade.

Greek Readings

On fifteen occasions, at the beginning of class you will turn in a translation of the authentic Greek readings assigned to discuss during that day's class. During the class we will take turns translating and interrogating the readings without the aid of the prepared translations. Each day can earn you 5 points; this score will depend on the preparation you reveal during the day and the effort you display in the handed-in portion. Greek readings together are worth 18.75% of your course grade.

Exams

There will be three midterm exams. Each is cumulative but will give priority to the newest material. Each will be worth 50pts (12.5% of your course grade). The final exam is cumulative, and worth 75pts (18.75% of your course grade).
