Please talk with your mentor about writing an IDP and consider attending this workshop.

Postdoc Spotlight

Heather grew up in **Tower City, PA**, a small town in the coal-mining region of Schuylkill County. She attended Shippensburg University majoring in Biology. Heather then got her PhD from the **University of Delaware** where she worked with Kenneth van Golen studying the role of RhoC GTPase and Akt in the setting of inflammatory breast cancer. Currently, Heather is starting her fourth year as a post-doc with Doug Stairs (**Pathology**). Heather's current work investigates the hypothesis that p12octn and EGFR signal through NFkB and downstream effectors to cause invasion in esophageal squamous cell carcinoma. In her spare time Heather enjoys spending time with her husband and two daughters especially when they can spend time outdoors! When there's extra time she loves to catch up on a **Notre Dame** game (which doesn't always go over well working at Penn State!)

Katie began working with Todd Schell (Micro/Immuno) in January where she is studying the role of β-adrenergic receptor signaling in the progression of melanoma and how these receptors relate to a patient's response to immunotherapy. Before coming to Penn State, Katie graduated from Duquesne University and received her PhD from Roswell Park Cancer Institute where she worked with Elizabeth Repasky. For her thesis, Katie studied the effects of housing-induced cold stress on tumor growth in mouse models. Katie grew up in Buffalo, NY and is a big fan of hometown teams: Buffalo Bills and Buffalo Sabres! Outside of work Katie enjoys visiting friends, trying craft beers and going to museums. She loves watching reruns of Law & Order (any version)! She is excited that winter and fall are on the horizon and anticipating the end of the humid PA summer!

Jocelyn has been working with Craig Meyers (Micro/Immuno) since Feburary 2012 where she studies infectivity and oncogenicity between human papillomavirus 16 (HPV16) European and African variants in ethnic specific human cervical keratinocytes. Before coming to Penn State, Jocelyn attended Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte, NC, and majored in biology. She went to graduate school at Howard University in Washington, DC, where she was mentored by Dr. Clarence Lee and Dr. Matty Knight. At Howard, Jocelyn studied the role of proteolytic enzymes in the host of the parasitic helminth that causes intestinal schistosomiasis. Jocelyn grew up on St. Helena Island, SC. Outside of work, she likes spending time with family and friends. Her favorite sports are basketball and football and her favorite football team is the Dallas Cowboys. Growing up on the SC coast, she looovveees seafood! Jocelyn calls herself a TV junkie! Her favorite shows are The Wire and Sons of Anarchy. She also likes to watch Game of Thrones, Suits, Scandal, Grey's Anatomy and the Blacklist.

George was born and raised in Thessaloniki, Greece where he received his BSc and MSc from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. About 5 years ago, he decided to come to the USA to pursue a career in lung diseases research. Back in Greece, George's research focused on the regulation of polyhydroxyalkanoids (PHA) in bacterium Thermus thermophilus in conjunction with the enzymes of PHA synthase and phosphotransacetylase. Here at Penn State, George works with Dr. Floros (Pediatrics) studying capdependent and cap-independent mechanisms and the role of cisacting elements and trans-acting factors on splicing and translation of the surfactant protein A, as well as the genome-wide tag SNP associations of candidate genes with lung disease susceptibility in the prematurely born infant. George loves working out at the gym and is always there right after work; so if anybody needs a gym buddy just let him know! He likes good food, craft beer and he is very good at grilling. George's favorite TV show is Breaking Bad and of course the Big Bang Theory (we all relate to that one in one way or the other, right?)
