





This information session will cover all the fellowship basics—what they are and how to apply for them.



Saved Searches / Auto Updates in PubMed

Would you like to save searches in PubMed or other NCBI databases? Or receive automatic updates to save you time from rerunning your search? Use your My NCBI account!

While in PubMed or an NCBI database such as Gene or Protein, run a search. You can sign into My NCBI at any time in the upper right of the page. In PubMed, click on Create Alert and if in another NCBI database, click Save search.



You will be asked to name your search and if you would like to receive email updates of new search results. You can select how often you will receive the reports. Feel free to do this for multiple searches! For more information, visit the NCBI support

ostdoc Spotlig



I joined Dr. Ziaur Rahman for my Post-doctoral training in May 2012 in Philadelphia. In Aug. 2012, Dr. Rahman moved to the department of Microbiology and Immunology at Hershey. I came along, and have been here since then. The lab works on Autoimmunity, with a focus on the disease Systemc Lupus Erythematosus (SLE). In SLE our own immune cells acquire reactivity to self-DNA, RNA, histones and other nucelar proteins and mount an immune response. The resulting atoantibodies produced by B cells deposit in vital organs leading to inflammation, organ failures and death. Several genetic and environmental factors affect SLE disease susceptibility and progression. We use SLE mouse models to address these aspects. My projects have focussed on a set of genes on chromosome 1 (SLAM genes) that alter the activation profile of B and T cells leading to SLE susceptibility. We have successfully defined the alterations in B and T cell functions caused by genetic mutations in the SLAM genes. Additionally, in another study we showed that an RNA sensing receptor (TLR7) in B cells is absolutely essential to generate the SLE associated autoantibodies.

My schooling, college and masters in Biochemistry were completed in India. I did my doctoral training at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bangalore, India, with Prof. Anjali Karande. My thesis work was on fetal tolerance. The fetus is almost like a transplanted organ in the female's body, yet the mother's body nurtures it as its own. Several mechanisms help prevent the mother's immune system from recognizing the fetus as foreign. I worked on a protein called "Glycodelin" produced by the uterine endometrium that causes apoptosis in activated immune cells inside the uterus and prevents them from attacking the fetus.

I grew up in the northern part of India, and then went to Grad School in the southern part of India, where I also found my life partner, Manjunath, also a Scientist. I love to read, sing (Bollywood songs) and paint. I like things clean and organized, so my free time also

involves a lot of cleaning alongside some good music. I love to cook Indian cuisines for friends and family. I am fanatic about "Friends" and enjoy all well made Sci-Fi movies.
