
IMMUNOLOGY 2017, organized by the American Association of Immunology, is the world's largest Immunology conference in terms of number of attendees. This was a great networking opportunity and platform to talk about our research. The research I presented in this meeting resulted from a discussion I had with Dr. Youngblood (co-corresponding author on this manuscript) at Immunology 2015. This time as well, we had exciting discussions with faculty and postdocs that could lead to collaboration in future. Overall, AAI conferences have been very productive for me.

I had an oral presentation and a poster where I discussed our research, "Cognate epitope is dispensable in maintenance of PD-1 expression on tissue-resident CD8+ T cells". PD-1 is an inhibitory receptor expressed on T cells, NK cells, macrophages and dendritic cells. Recently, it has become a target for cancer immunotherapy, yet our understanding about PD-1 is very limited in other contexts outside of autoimmunity and cancer. The focus of our study is to understand the regulation of PD-1 expression on tissue resident CD8 T cells (T_{RM}) in the brain upon mouse polyomavirus infection. We showed the maintenance of PD-1 expression on brain T_{RM} cells is independent of inflammation or the presence of the cognate epitope. We further showed, during persistent brain infection with mouse polyomavirus, CD8 T_{RM} cells' effector

function is inhibited due to the expression of PD-1, potentially protecting the CNS from excessive neural injury and immunopathology.

I would like to extend my gratitude towards the office of postdoctoral affairs for "Bond & Bradley Postdoc Travel Award" and The American Association of Immunologists (AAI) for "2017 AAI Trainee Abstract Award", both of which helped me to attend this conference. This study would not have been possible without the mentorship of Prof. Aron Lukacher. I also would like to thank our institutional flow cytometry core facility and the support from our collaborators at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Memphis, TN for the epigenetics analysis.
