
GETTING TO KNOW SOME OF THE NEW POSTDOCS



Dr. Sophia I. Allen, 3rd year Postdoctoral Fellow in the Department of Public Health Sciences, is the recipient of Penn State University's first National Institutes of Health (NIH) Supplement to Promote Diversity in Health-Related Research Grant (Diversity Supplement, PA-18-906). Her research will assess the social and economic factors that influence participation in a clinical trial of adult cigarette smokers and their attempt to switch to an e-cigarette (U01DA045517-01S1, \$132,505). Dr. Allen's faculty mentor, Dr. Jonathan Foulds, Professor in the Departments of Public Health Sciences and Psychiatry received the NIH award titled, "Does Switching to Nicotine-Containing Electronic Cigarettes Reduce Health Risk Markers?" (U01DA045517, \$766,492) to understand the health effects of cigarette smokers switching to a Standardized Research E-Cig (SREC) and to assess the role of nicotine delivery on switching, acceptability and markers of health outcomes. NIH Diversity Supplements are used to improve the diversity of the research workforce by recruiting and supporting students, postdoctorates, and eligible investigators from groups that have been shown to be underrepresented in health-related sciences on a national basis. 
