


Figure 1: Publication Timeline

#### Identification of studies via databases




Figure 2: Record Identification and Screening Process in the PRISMA 2020 Flow Diagram for New Systematic Reviews (adapted from Page et al., 2021)

#### **Key Terms Defined**

Acculturation: process of adopting dominant culture

Affective: encompasses attitudes and emotions

Behavioral: encompasses practices

**Enculturation**: process of maintaining heritage culture

Familismo: obligation and loyalty to family

Marianismo: expectations of purity, spirituality, & family

Machismo: strong pride, dominance and toughness

# Cultural profiles

- 1. High affective acculturation  $\rightarrow$  drinking frequency increased
- Low enculturation  $\rightarrow$  alcohol-related consequences increased
- Low enculturation + low acculturation  $\rightarrow$ drinking decreased
- **❖** Peer drinking norms *typical* student referent
- \* Familismo
  - protective for males, risk for females

### Aim 2: Gender, Sex, Ethnic Subgroup differences

#### **Traditional Gender Role Beliefs:**

- 1. virtuosity/chaste of marianismo protective, but not under high stress
- 2. dominance/toughness of traditional machismo and low cultural congruity risk factors
