
Cooking With Friends Interest Group

Speaker: DR. SANDRA SPANIER

Penn State Edwin Erle Sparks Professor of English and Women's Studies





Dr. Spanier, general editor of the Hemingway Letters Project since 2002, will talk about her research and her work on the Hemingway Letters project to locate, research and publish the complete collected letters of Ernest Hemingway.

The Hemingway Letters Project is headquartered at Penn State and involves an international team of scholars. It is projected to ultimately result in seventeen volumes containing some 6,000 letters. Never intended for publication, Hemingway's letters track his life story, record experiences that inspired his art, afford insight into his creative

process, and reveal a more interesting and complex person than his "tough guy" public persona would suggest. Volume 5, spanning 1932 through May 1934, was published in 2020.

UWC ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP NEWS

Cheers to Us! It's **Now over \$150,000!!** Once again, University Women's Club members were very responsive to the Club's year-end request for support of the UWC Endowed Scholarship co-authored by Teddy Nicholas and Casey Goodall. I'm overjoyed to report that the UWC endowment account has grown to over \$150,000 as a result. The names of members who have contributed to the scholarship since last winter's newsletter appear in this edition of the newsletter. It is especially heartwarming to see the many donations made in memory or in honor of family members and fellow UWC members.

If you attended the September Kick Off held at the Penn Stater, you had the opportunity to meet and hear from this year's scholarship recipients and the recipient of the 2021 UWC Book Award. You learned a bit about Kapri Urie, who received our Book Award, in the Fall Newsletter. Read on to learn about Anna VanAlstein and Tamar Fetzer, the 2021-22 undergraduate and graduate student scholarship recipients respectively.

Anna VanAlstine returned to Penn State to earn her second undergraduate degree in Meteorology and Atmospheric Science after having graduated with a degree in Finance from Penn State's Behrend College in 2010. Anna started her second academic journey in summer 2017 while working full time at SPE Federal Credit Union. Anna said that she shed many tears her first year back as a student trying to re-teach herself simple high school mathematics like exponential rules while taking engineering calculus and general physics courses in addition to working full time in business lending.

In December 2018, Anna's hard work paid off when she joined Penn State's Astronomy and Astrophysics Department as a financial assistant. She now supports four NASA-sponsored missions, the longest running and largest being the Neil Gehrel's Swift Mission. Anna will graduate with her second bachelor's degree in Meteorology and Atmospheric Science this May and present research at the American Meterological Society's annual conference this month. Anna thanks the UWC for our support and confidence in her. "I cannot adequately express how appreciative I am of your assistance and how being a recipient of the endowed scholarship has validated the risk I took in chasing my dreams."

Tamara Fetzer graduated from Penn State in 2009 with her bachelor's degree in Human Development and Family Studies with an emphasis on Children, Youth and Families. As a State High student, Tamara took a childhood development course and realized that working with young children was her calling. Following graduation from PSU, Tamara has worked in child care centers and is currently a supervising preschool teacher at University Park's Child Care Center at Hort Woods.

Tamara is a master's degree candidate in Curriculum and Instruction and plans to graduate in December 2022. This advanced degree will enable Tamara to advocate and provide support that these centers and teachers need in order to better serve children and their families. While working on her graduate degree, Tamara has been a single mother of two sons, Landon and Dawson, and has been a full-time employee. She wrote, "This scholarship not only financially supports my goal, but also makes me feel recognized and believed in by all of you.
