The Wilkes-Barre Extension School from State College is now rapidly developing. From the many students who are enrolling it would indicate that record-breaking classes will be started in all subjects offered. In fact, it appears now as if State College will put a high class teacher here on full time so that he can devote his entire time to meeting classes, instead of spending but three days a week here as is customary.

Dr. Edwin E. Sparks, Ph. D., LL. D., the president of Pennsylvania State College, will be here Thursday night to formally open the school.
