

EXTENSION SCHOOL COURSE EXPLAINED

An interesting talk was that given last night by Dr. Edwin B. Sparks, president of State College, in the auditorium of the Y. M. C. A. last night, in connection with the proposed extension school of engineering, to be conducted by State College here, and which will soon be formally opened. He referred to the success that has been attained by the other sixty schools of this kind in other parts of the State.

D. F. Williams presided at the meeting and the speaker was introduced by George Nicholson. A quartet from State College was present and sang several pleasing selections. The members of the quartet are: Messrs. Stoeltzing, Bort, McDowell and Calenach. One of the interesting features of the meeting were the motion pictures, showing college life at this well known institution.

After the meeting at the Y. M. C. A. about thirty of the local graduates of State College tendered Dr. Sparks a dinner at the Sterling Hotel, which proved an enjoyably affair. The college quartet was again present and rendered several selections.

Norman C. Miller of the college is now in the city and is enrolling students. His headquarters are at the Chamber of Commerce rooms. Over 100 students have registered so far and it is expected the number will be swelled to 150. Three courses are to be taught when the school opens, which will include mechanical drawing, elementary electricity and elementary mechanics.
