### Oil Output Up By 463,000 Barrels

Washington, Sept. 8.—The Bureau of Mines reported today that the July supply of oil and refined petroleum totaled 53,970,000 barrels, an increase of 463,000 over July, 1937.

Stocks of motor fuel were 81,345,000 barrels compared with 87,482,000 in June and 71,550,000 in July a year ago.

Finished and unfinished gasoline stocks on July 31 totaled 75,328,000 barrels, 3,998,000 less than on June 30, but about 4,600,000 more than a year ago.
