Why? The Public Access Policy

Requires all **peer-reviewed** articles arising from NIH funds to be submitted to PubMed Central (digital archive)

*Advance
science &
improve human
health:*

- Allowing tax payers to view publications
- Find similar research that has been supported by NIH

Who Must Comply?

- Principal Investigators funded by NIH
 - You are responsible for making sure that everyone on your project team complies with the policy
- Researchers who have received **support** from the Population Research Institute (or any NIH-funded center): sub awards & seed grants
 - This includes *any* kind of research support: computing; seminars, training & events; grant support; data & analysis; publications & communication

What needs to be deposited?

- Manuscripts accepted by **peer-reviewed** journal on or after 4/7/2008
- Manuscript is a **product** of NIH direct funding, including sub-awards or **support** from a NIH-funded research center
- Funding was active in fiscal year 2008 or later
- Books, book chapters & presentations do not need to be deposited (but can be added into the system to be used in progress reports)

Today – Acknowledge!

Big Time Saver!

Acknowledge:

- In submitted manuscript: add an 'acknowledgement' section
 - Remember: you can add multiple grants
 - Disclaimer
- In cover letter to publisher

When must manuscripts be deposited?

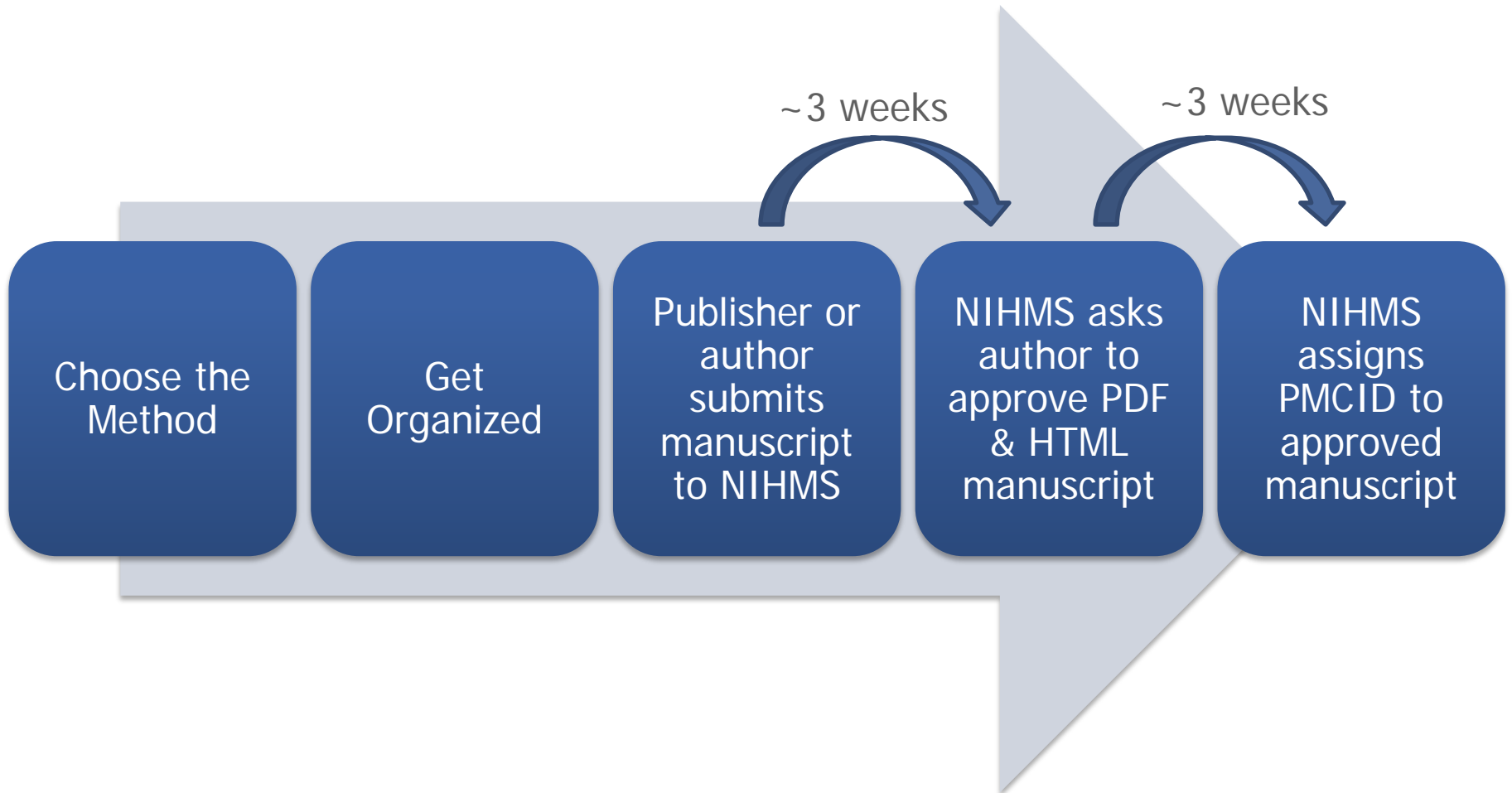
Newly-accepted articles:

- Upon acceptance for publication

Past Articles (published between 4/7/2008 and now)

- As soon as possible
- It is essential to do it before writing your next progress report or grant proposal
- Suggestion: work from current back to 2008

Roadmap of the Process



Choose a Method

Method	A	B	C	D
	<u>Journal</u> deposits final published articles in PubMed Central without author involvement	Author asks publisher to deposit specific final published article in PMC – costs \$	Author deposits final peer-reviewed manuscript in PMC via the NIHMS	<u>Publisher</u> submits upon acceptance for publication – Authors ensure the manuscript is deposited into the NIHMS and approves PDF.
Examples	Demography and Pediatrics	Rarely used	Wiley-Blackwell and Sage	Elsevier, John Wiley & Sons, Taylor & Francis, Springer

Tool

Get Organized

Publisher. Identify the journal and publishing company of your article

* Use a search engine like [Google](#)

Co-Authors. Decide who will be responsible for depositing the article

Manuscript Files. Assemble the manuscript files for your article. This is the version of the article that was **accepted for publication**, NOT the copy-edited or published version.

Grant Numbers. If PRI services were used, your research was supported by R24HD041025

Common Questions & Concerns

My article is already indexed in PubMed

PubMed is not the same as PubMed Central.

I don't have an NIH grant

You still must deposit in PubMed Central if you received **support services** from PRI, which is a NIH-funded center.

Doesn't the first author have to submit?

No – covered in the 'tools' section ahead (NIHMS)

Don't most journals submit for me?

No. Most demography, sociology, and family journals do not. Authors must initiate the process. Method C

Method C

Deposit peer-reviewed manuscript: [NIH Video](#)

Look for the following:

- Blue circles w/question marks
- Where to enter grant number(s)
- **Delay** release (Max = 12 months)

- Contact publisher: usually the permissions office. Editors can also be helpful. [Example](#)
- Common publishers:
 - Wiley-Blackwell: permissionsuk@wiley.com
 - Springer: [website request form](#)
 - Sage: permissions@sagepub.com
 - Elsevier: AuthorSupport@elsevier.com

Possible Responses

- Publisher will deposit
 - NIHMS will ask author to approve manuscript (PDF & HTML)
 - Approved manuscript is assigned PMCID number
- Author needs to deposit
 - Publisher may request a delay (max=12 months)
 - NIHMS will ask author to approve manuscript (PDF & HTML)
 - Approved manuscript is assigned PMCID number

Navigating NIHMS

- Use My NCBI login information
- Monitoring progress
- Approve PDF/HTML: use “submit new manuscript” button
- Assign PDF reviewer (approve): last stage: PDF review
