Such applications can include underground mine tunnel monitoring and rockfall and landslide site monitoring. This is important in ensuring the safety of employees exposed to these sites on a daily basis as well as anyone else who may be in the immediate vicinity. Increased accuracy may help to better predict the occurrence of such natural disasters and aid in implementing prevention solutions.

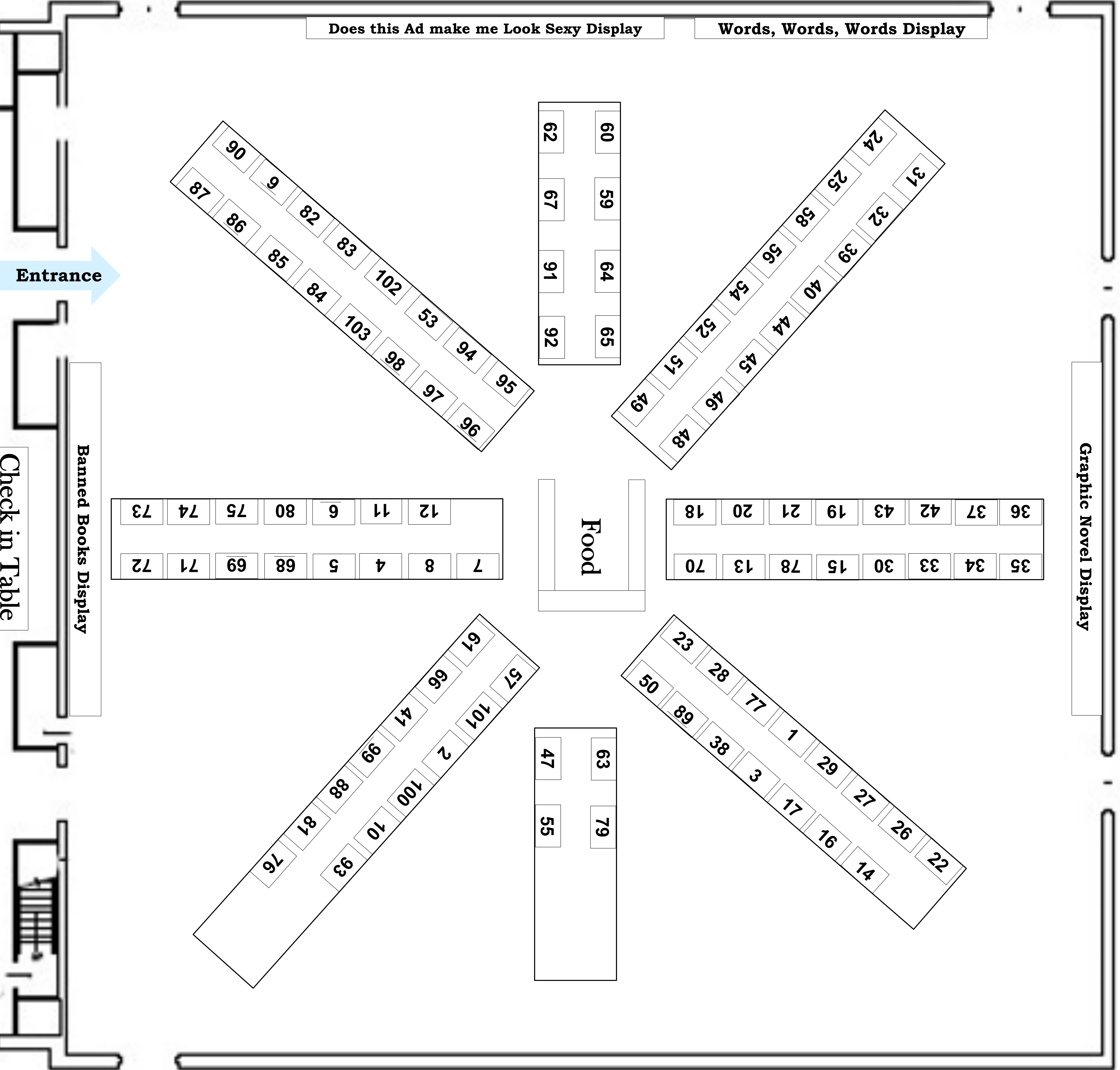
